# NAERIC DRAFT HORSE CLASSIC

## Statement of Purpose

- 1) Promote quality draft horses that are well conformed and will hitch/harness/drive well, have the capability to work and will look good when engaged in these activities.
- 2) Create an incentive to develop and train all horses in a humane manner, protecting at all times their physical and mental potential.
- 3) Promote resistance-free training methods resulting in a more efficient horse and to establish a greater market for good draft horses.
- 4) Provide an event that is enjoyable to spectators.
- 5) Provide an event that is beneficial to the draft horse industry.

## The Concept

Members will nominate and sell their registered and/or non-registered weanling(s) with fifty (50) percent of the selling price going to the breeder of record (owner of the mare at the time of foaling); thirty-five (35) percent of the selling price going to the futurity purse; five (5) percent of the selling price going to a Breeders' Award Program; and ten (10) percent of the selling price going to operating/administrative expenses.

Horses, sold as weanlings, will return after training to compete in an event that will demonstrate their quality, conformation and performance using as a standard an acceptable level of suitability for purpose as determined by the competition judge(s).

## Membership Committee

MEMBERSHIP IS OPEN TO ALL DRAFT HORSE BREEDERS. In order to participate, breeders must be members of the NAERIC DRAFT HORSE CLASSIC Committee. There is a one-time, lifetime membership<sup>1,2</sup> fee of \$250.00.

In addition to the lifetime membership fee, there will be an annual renewal fee of fifty (50) dollars; payable beginning in the next calendar year after the lifetime membership fee has been paid, but in no case after June 30<sup>th</sup> of that year.

Each membership carries with it one (1) seat, a single voting right, on the NAERIC DRAFT HORSE CLASSIC Committee.

1 Membership will lapse if a member fails to sell a weanling for two (2) consecutive years. Membership reinstatement is possible, but the above indicated fee structure will be imposed.

2 The \$250.00 membership rate will be offered to all people that are 21 years of age and younger as of January 1 each year.

## Program Rules

- 1) Each member will be limited to a total of two (2) weanling nominations each year.
- 2) Immediate family members that are materially participating (500 hours per year; average 10 hours per week) in the farm/ranch/program, or have the same farm/ranch/program prefix and are listed as the “breeder of record” are allowed to fall under one membership.
- 3) For all weanlings going through the sale ring, fifty (50) percent of the final bid price will be paid to the NAERIC DRAFT HORSE CLASSIC Sale and Futurity.
- 4) To qualify for the two-year-old futurity, all horses must have gone through the NAERIC DRAFT HORSE CLASSIC sale ring. All horses, prior to entering the sale ring, must be micro-chipped (electronically identified) through a committee-approved process.
- 5) Every person to nominate a weanling to the sale must be a NAERIC DRAFT HORSE CLASSIC Committee member AND the breeder of record (based on the breed registry definition) on that weanling’s registration certificate. Non-registered horses must follow the same rules as non-registered NAERIC Advantage horses. Horses changing ownership after the Sale but before the Futurity, retain their eligibility for the Futurity, if and only if, the Committee has been notified by said horse’s current owner. To avoid a late fee, the notification must be made to the Committee by June 30. All moneys will go to the current owner of the entry.
- 6) The Canadian Western Agribition Committee reserves the right to refuse any entry not fit or ready for the sale or futurity.
- 7) Canadian Western Agribition rules will apply unless otherwise stated.
- 8) Members may nominate their weanlings to the sale up to June 30<sup>th</sup> of each year. If space is limited by stall availability, first-come-first-served, based on postmark date will apply.
- 9) All dates of compliance will be based on postmark date.
- 10) All fees and payouts are based on Canadian denomination.
- 11) All horses must have a negative Coggins Test dated no earlier than September 1 of the year of the Sale.
- 12) All weanlings must enter, pay regular entry fees and show in their respective breed class at Agribition. Non-registered weanlings will show in a non-registered weanling class.
- 13) Two-year-olds returning to the Futurity must enter, pay regular entry fees and show in their respective breed class at Agribition.
- 14) Any dispute/complaint must be submitted in writing to the Committee chair, within 24 hours of the alleged infraction, with a fee of \$250.00 cash. The dispute/complaint will be heard at the next regular meeting of the Committee. If the Committee votes to dismiss the dispute/complaint, the fee will be forfeited. If the Committee upholds the dispute/complaint, the fee will be returned.
- 15) The Executive Committee has the power to ensure adequate numbers for the sale.

## **Fees**

### **For Purchaser**

- 1) ALL ENTRY FEES TO THE NAERIC DRAFT HORSE CLASSIC FUTURITY ARE PAID FOR THE NEW OWNERS WITH THEIR PURCHASE OF THE WEANLING.
- 2) There is an office fee and judge's fee payable by the person entering the two-year-old in the futurity. The fee must be paid no later than October 1<sup>st</sup>, the fee is \$150 and includes a listing of the horse in the program. After October 1<sup>st</sup>, no additional entries will be allowed.

### **For Consignor**

- 1) By June 30<sup>th</sup>, a \$150 fee per weanling must be received with each nomination to the sale. Members are responsible for their own halter, lead, Destron Fearing microchip and transfer fee. If members want halters, leads, and microchips ordered for them, please call Lori at 502-245-0425, ext. 12 at least 2 months before the sale. If the nomination is not received by June 30<sup>th</sup>, the consignment will not be allowed.

### **For Administration**

Auctioneer fees and advertising for the weanling sale are all paid out of the administrative budget allocation of ten (10) percent.

## **Sale**

Sale order will be determined by the Executive Committee and David Carson.

### **General Information**

#### **Bids**

- The Auctioneer will accept all bids, other than those considered to be irresponsible. The bidder offering the highest bid shall be the Buyer. In case of dispute as to the successful bidder, the horse shall again be put up for advance bids, and if there be no advance bids, the horse shall be sold to the bidder from whom the Auctioneer accepted the last bid. In all cases the Auctioneer's decision is final.

#### **Terms**

- GST will be added to all purchases.
- Payment of the sale price shall be made in cash or cheque, payable at par at the sale location, unless satisfactory arrangements have been made prior to the sale. Buyers unknown to David Carson Farms & Auction Services, Ltd. (Auction Company) are required to bring a bank reference. Current exchange rate will be announced prior to the start of the sale.
- The right of the property does not change hands until full settlement is made.
- Auction Company reserves the right to require a certified cheque before any horse is released.

- Should any Buyer fail to settle for his/her purchase, the Auction Company reserves the full power to resell the horse to their best advantage, either privately or publicly, without further notice. Any loss resulting from such resale, and all other expenses arising from this, are payable by the original Buyer.
- The Buyer agrees not to stop payment on his/her cheque for any reason. A charge of \$50.00 (CAD) will be made on any cheque that is returned. All payment discrepancies will be dealt with to the fullest extent pursuant to Canadian law.
- All cheques should be made payable to "NAERIC Draft Horse Classic."
- Proceeds to Sellers will be payable by the NAERIC Draft Horse Classic (DHC) and will be mailed out as soon as Buyers' cheques clear the banks, and before December 31, 2009.
- Settlement must be made no later than one (1) hour after the sale has concluded.
- Horses shall not be released to the Buyer until satisfactory settlement has been made. Prior to the release of the horse(s), the Barn Supervisor will distribute release forms.
- Horses will not be released until 12:00 p.m., Tuesday, November 24, 2009.
- Stalls must be vacated by 7:00 p.m., Tuesday, November 24, 2009.
- Each horse becomes the risk of the Buyer as soon as the horse is declared sold.
- Delivery is the responsibility of the Buyer.

***The above terms constitute a contract between the Buyer and the Seller and shall be equally binding on both parties. Resale of the horse following the sale shall constitute a separate transaction and is not covered by the terms of this sale.***

### **Papers**

- Copies of registration papers will be furnished to the Buyer when payment is made. Original papers will be held by the DHC until cheques have cleared the banks and/or the four (4) day guarantee has elapsed, at which time the DHC will forward the original papers and transfer documents to the respective breed associations for processing. For registered horses, the registration papers must be in the name of the Seller, or the horse will sell as grade.
- Transfer fees, appropriate for each breed association, will be charged against the account of the Seller.

### **Errors**

Every effort has been made to assure correctness of the Sale Catalog but the DHC Committee, NAERIC staff, Canadian Western Agribition (CWA) staff, and/or the Auction Company are not responsible for errors or omissions, and assume no liability on its part as to any statements regarding horses sold. Any error noted in the Sale Catalog will be announced from the Auctioneer's stand. Any announcements from the Auctioneer's stand will take precedence over any matter in the Sale Catalog.

### **Liability**

- All persons attend the Sale at their own risk. The DHC Committee, NAERIC staff, CWA staff, and the Auction Company, and/or their/its representatives nor any other person connected with this sale assumes any liability, legal or otherwise, for the safety of the building or premises, for the behavior of the horses, or for any loss or damage of persons or property.
- It is clearly understood the Auction Company is acting as agent between Buyer and Seller and is not responsible in any way for failure by either party to complete their transaction.

## **Warrantees**

- The Seller has the responsibility to declare any known or observed defects in their horse(s). What is a defect to one person may not be a defect to another. Veterinary assistance, at the Buyer's expense, will be available on the CWA show grounds.
- All horses sell as sound unless otherwise stated. The Buyer has the responsibility to examine the horses carefully before bidding. Seller Declaration Forms will be available for inspection prior to bidding. Any known or observed illness, injury or defect will be noted and announced from the Auctioneer's stand prior to the sale of the horse. Buyers will have four (4) days from the time of the sale to notify the DHC if they feel that the horse has been misrepresented. This must be done in writing and be accompanied by a veterinarian's report (at the Buyer's expense) that the said injury, illness, or physical defect was present at the time of the sale, was not announced and did not occur after the sale. Cash, or a certified cheque, in the amount of a \$200.00(CAD) protest fee, must be made payable to the DHC. The DHC will then seek an opinion (at the DHC's expense) from the DHC's designated veterinarian. If the DHC's veterinarian agrees with the Buyer's veterinarian, the purchase price will be refunded to the Buyer along with the \$200.00 (CAD) protest fee, when the horse is returned safely to the Seller. If the Buyer's veterinary opinion differs from the DHC's veterinary opinion, the DHC reserves the right to obtain the opinion of a referee veterinarian (at the Seller's expense). The majority veterinary opinion shall apply. In the event the sale of the horse is upheld, the \$200.00 (CAD) protest fee will be retained by the DHC.
- All warrantees terminate four (4) days (96 hours) from 3:30 p.m., November 23, 2009.
- The Buyer assumes full ownership and responsibility for the horse from the fall of the Auctioneers gavel for the care and maintenance of said horse from that point on.

## **Coggins**

- All horses entered in the sale will have a negative Coggins Test, for Equine Infectious Anemia, dated no earlier than September 1 of the year of the sale.

## **Transportation**

- Assistance in making transportation arrangements will be provided when possible.

## **Mail and Telephone Bids**

- Mail and telephone bids will be considered but arrangements must be made prior to the sale.

## **Insurance**

- If desired, insurance will be available, at the Buyer's expense, to insure purchase(s).

## **Special Notes**

- This sale is conducted as the official sale of the NAERIC Draft Horse Classic Sale and Futurity. Inspect a NAERIC Draft Horse Classic Sale and Futurity Program description before bidding. Information can be obtained about this program by writing or phoning the North American Equine Ranching Information Council or visiting their website at: [www.naeric.org](http://www.naeric.org).

- The entry fee to the NAERIC Draft Horse Classic Futurity is paid **with the Buyer's purchase** of the weanling or yearling. There is an office fee to be paid by the Buyer at time of Futurity nomination.
- **Any occurrences not covered by the Program and/or Sale Rules, will be addressed by The NAERIC Draft Horse Classic Committee with all rights of decision reserved.**

### **Horse Inspection**

- Horses may be inspected up to sale time by the CWA staff, DHC Committee and/or their representatives. Horses deemed unfit for the caliber of this sale may be removed from the sale with no recourse against the CWA, the DHC Committee, NAERIC or the Auction Company or their/its representatives.

The promoter of the Draft Horse Classic is the North American Equine Ranching Information Council (NAERIC). It is a non-profit association representing approximately 64 equine ranchers in Saskatchewan, Manitoba, and North Dakota, who are engaged in the collection of pregnant mares' urine (PMU), used for the production of estrogen replacement therapy to treat symptoms for menopause and bone disease or osteoporosis. ## **Futurity**

- 1) This is one (1) event, consisting of three (3) equal divisions as follows: NAERIC Draft Horse Classic Line Class, NAERIC Draft Horse Classic Pattern Cart Class, NAERIC Draft Horse Classic Hitch Cart Class. Points are totaled to determine a winner.
- 2) There will be three (3) judges. A tiebreaker judge will be designated prior to the event. Judges will not confer on their placing.
- 3) There are two (2) levels of participation as follows: youth and open. Note both levels of participation will compete together, with announcements of the top placing youth and open contestant.
- 4) The order of "go" will be determined by draw, one (1) hour before the start of the event.
- 5) The class may be split; a drive off may be requested in the cart class.
- 6) The winner of the Futurity will be the horse receiving the most points overall from the three (3) divisions.
- 7) Horses placing in the top ten (10) in each class will be given one (1) point plus an additional point for each horse placing below them, not to exceed ten (10) points for first place. Points are calculated on ten (10) placings only. Horses may be lined up head to tail, for each judge's placing, at the conclusion of each class.
- 8) Horses will be examined walking and trotting between three cones/markers. At each of these points, a judge will be stationed. Each judge may rework a maximum of three (3) horses without designation of which award they are being considered for.
- 9) Horses must show in all divisions to receive prize money or an award.
- 10) The top ten (10) finishers of the Futurity must be available for presentations and pictures in the sale ring immediately prior to the start of the Sale.
- 11) If less than 10 horses are entered in the futurity, purse money will only be awarded to the number of horses competing. The remaining purse money will be put back into the program under Operation/Administration.

## **Lady Driver Division for 2009**

A maximum of \$2,500.00 added purse to be paid to the hi-point lady drivers. Eligible lady drivers must be listed as the registered owner or co-owner with the breed association at time of Futurity entry, and exhibit the two-year-old in all components of the competition. Up to four places will be paid out as: **\$1,000.00, \$750.00, \$500.00, and \$250.00.**

## **NAERIC Draft Horse Classic Line Class**

Emphasis to be placed on an individual that is conformationally correct and sound on all feet and legs. Balance, breed type, form to function, smoothness of body parts, eye appeal and the action of the individual all to be considered. All breeds, all sexes, to show in the same class.

## **NAERIC Draft Horse Classic Hitch Cart Class**

Designed to show a free, easy moving individual that is relaxed, with alert ears, moving balanced with a non-intimidated, forward way of going, and bright and responsive to the driver at various gaits. All breeds, all sexes, to show in the same class.

Rail work, in both directions of the ring, will consist of walking and trotting. Judging will be based on the horse's overall performance and way of going as well as its ability to hold the designated gait. Action, headset, type and eye appeal all to count. Horses may be asked to back.

## **NAERIC Draft Horse Classic Pattern Cart Class**

Will consist of an individual pattern or work, designed to show how well broke the horse is. Work will consist of a simple pattern designed for a two-year-old.

- 1) Enter the arena at a walk toward the right.
- 2) Trot a complete circle then cut a figure 8.
- 3) Stop in center of figure 8.
- 4) Fan left, 90 degrees, pause.
- 5) Fan right, 180 degrees, and pause. Fan left 90 degrees.
- 6) With headman (optional), driver is to pick up each foreleg.
- 7) At will, go to the right and enter keyhole. Drive around keyhole and exit.
- 8) Go to the left and walk through rails. Cart wheels must be completely past the rails. Then, back clear through the rails.
- 9) Drive to the right of the rails and exit arena at will.

Pattern only to be judged, with emphasis on the correctness of each element and overall smoothness of the pattern. Speed is not the object. Elements to be judged at the two-year-old ability level.

## **Scoring Guide**

- 1) The pattern class consists of 300 total points. Scribes may be used to mark the scores at the judge's request. The five elements judged will be scored according to the following point scale:

|        |                  |        |         |

| 0 – 10 | Figure 8         | 0 –100 | Keyhole |
| 0 – 45 | Fan              | 0 –100 | Rails   |
| 0 – 45 | Pick up forelegs |        |         |

It is important that the score for each element be reflected on a maneuver by maneuver and penalty by penalty basis. This class is placed.

- 2) Penalties, per obstacle, to be given for the following:

Fifty (50)-point penalty- refusal, bucking, kicking, and rearing  
One hundred (100)-point penalty- blatant disobedience, going off pattern  
Dismissal - excessive abuse, horse or driver falling to the ground (driver's foot touching

or horse's shoulder touching), excessive use of whip, or horse behavior considered a danger to themselves or others

## **Equipment**

- 1) All horses are to be shown in standard equipment.
- 2) All drivers to show in appropriate attire.
- 3) Use of inhumane training devices and/or equipment will not be tolerated, in the show arena or designated warm up arena, and will be cause for elimination from the competition.
- 4) Horses and equipment are subject to examination by show management and/or judges in the show arena and designated warm-up arenas at all times.

## **Exhibitors**

Exhibitors may be changed as long as the Committee and the announcer are informed of the change at time of draw for "go" order, which is one (1) hour before the competition begins.

## **Youth**

Must be less than 18 years of age as of January 1 of the current year. S/he may show eligible horse regardless of ownership.

## **Futurity Pay Out Structure**

Up to ten (10) places will be paid. Payout amounts will be based on thirty-five (35) percent of the weanling gross sales generated when those weanlings sold. As an example, the total available purse for a two-year-old competition in the year 2009, will be thirty-five (35) percent of the gross sale revenues from weanlings sold in 2007.

For year 2009 (foals of 2007) purse distribution is:

## **Breeders' Awards**

Distribution of the 5% of gross sales dedicated to Breeders' Awards is:

Breeder of the 1<sup>st</sup> Place finisher receives 2.5%  
Breeder of the 2<sup>nd</sup> Place finisher receives 1.5%  
Breeder of the 3<sup>rd</sup> Place finisher receives 1.0%

## **Rights Reserved by the NAERIC DRAFT HORSE CLASSIC Committee**

- 1) The Committee reserves the right to reject any entry not believed to match the sale entry.
- 2) The Committee reserves the right to inspect all horses and match them to the registration papers, or in the case of non-registered the identification form on file, from the weanling sale.
- 3) The Committee reserves the right to decide any point not covered by the rules and to correct any errors or make any alterations as it sees fit.
- 4) The Committee reserves the right to change date and locations of the NAERIC DRAFT HORSE CLASSIC Sale and Futurity.
- 5) The Committee reserves the right to drug test any, and all, Futurity entries for illegal or controlled substance, according to Canadian Western Agribition rules.
- 6) The Committee reserves the right to hold another NAERIC DRAFT HORSE CLASSIC Sale (Spring) of yearlings and/or two-year-olds making them eligible for the Futurity.
